## **NEVADA'S NEW ADVANCE DIRECTIVES REGISTRY OFFERS FREE FILING SERVICE AT WWW.LIVINGWILLLOCKBOX.COM**

Documents like living wills, various powers of attorney related to health care and other advance directives are an opportunity to tell health care professionals and family members your end-of-life care preferences. But if those health care professionals and others do not have access to a living will or advance directive, they may not know the your final wishes. Nevada's newly established Registry of Advance Directives, known as the Nevada Living Will Lockbox, ensures that a living will or similar document is securely stored and easily accessible by healthcare providers when needed.

The Living Will Lockbox is a secure, password protected database that stores advanced directives in a common web-based location. Access to the documents is restricted to the individual filing with the Lockbox, others authorized by that individual and authorized health care providers.

"The Secretary of State's office manages the state's corporate filings and the statewide voter registration database, so we have the experience to maintain this type of secure Lockbox," said Miller. "The Living Will Lockbox is about providing Nevadans with the assurance that their wishes regarding the course of their medical treatment will be protected."

Use of the Living Will Lockbox is free to all Nevadans and registering as a user or authorized healthcare provider is very simple. By visiting [www.livingwilllockbox.com](http://www.livingwilllockbox.com), Nevadans and representatives of healthcare institutions can download the registration forms and send the completed forms and documents to be filed with the Living Will Lockbox to the Nevada Secretary of State. Once registered, individuals will receive a wallet size card with their password for accessing their advance directives. Authorized provider requests can generally be completed in less than a week. Changes to the documents may be made at any time through a simple procedure similar to the registration process.
